Examples for the Turabian Style of Documentation

Kate L. Turabian's *A Manual for Writers of Term Papers, Theses and Dissertations* recommends using footnotes as the method for documenting quotations, paraphrases, summaries, and other material from a source used in your paper, although other methods are also introduced. Footnotes are listed numerically at the bottom of the page, preceded by superscript numerals, and include much the same information as bibliographic entries found in a Bibliography list at the end of your paper.

For types of documents not shown here, consult *A Manual for Writers of Term Papers, Theses and Dissertations* available in the University of Manitoba Libraries' collection.
